Greetings River Road family!

Greetings River Road family! I am so excited to come and serve God with you all as your pastor. My first day in the office is June 27 and my first Sunday is July 2. Already I have been warmly welcomed by the folks on the SPRC Committee, the Church Council and by the amazing staff. I am humbled and honored to be appointed to serve with all of them and all of you. I look forward to learning names and hearing your faith stories. Robert and I are excited to join you in the amazing work you are already doing for the kingdom of God.

Recently, I joined with the Church Council and staff in an onboarding process. This was a helpful orientation for me to the priorities, passions and history of River Road. As part of the process people were invited to ask me questions. I would like to share some of those questions and answers with you so that you can get to know me better.

1. What is your call story?

There are so many bits and pieces to my ongoing call story. I will share some of those bits and pieces in sermons over the summer. The "aha!" moment I had was actually in a Christian Education class at Memphis Theological Seminary. A deacon, Dr. Virginia Lee, paused her planned lecture to tell us her call story. I remember she specifically said, "My call story was not a one-time mountain top experience, it has been a series of moments that kept calling me to ordained ministry." I felt like she was talking just to me. The Holy Spirit had been nudging me for years, late night faith conversations with friends on the floor of the chapel at Sewanee, words of affirmation after I taught a Sunday School lesson, cousins at a family reunion in Texas asking me to lead a worship and blessing service when the priest that had been invited had to cancel. After that class, I went home to my husband and nervously said, "I think Jesus is calling me to be an ordained pastor." Rob looked at me and said, "I already knew that. I'm glad you know it now too." That was my blessed assurance moment that I was on the right path and my life has been better ever since I invited the Holy Spirit to walk next to me, rather than trying to dodge the nudges.

2. What is your favorite thing to preach on? Love. I believe our universal human purpose is to learn to love God, love our neighbor and love ourselves perfectly. In July and August I will be preaching on my current favorite Bible verses, "Jesus replied, 'You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind...You must love your neighbor as you love yourself." Matthew 22:37-40

3. What is your favorite color? Purple.

4. What are you excited about at River Road? I have heard from your current members and former pastors about your passion for missions. I am excited to be at a vibrant, active church that cares for one another deeply. I have heard and seen the amazing worship services you all participate in to honor and praise God. I have already seen so many spiritual gifts that people are using to help

ONGOING NEEDS - FOOD PANTRIES AND SAFE HARBOR

Our food pantry partners are seeing record numbers almost every week. We are delighted that Daniel O'Neill has stepped up to lead the food pantry ministry.

Most-needed items remain the same -peanut butter; 15 oz. cans of tomato sauce; 1 lb. spaghetti; canned fruit and vegetables; canned soups and beans; canned chicken and tuna; boxed cereal; oatmeal; ravioli/spaghettios; non-refrigerated microwave meals; diapers and wipes (sizes 4, 5 and 6 are most needed). Standard, non-glass container sizes are appreciated for packing purposes. Watch the app, as well as email, for weekly updates that highlight particular needs.

UMCOR HYGIENE KITS

Our church, including Missions Committee members and United Women in Faith, donated a total of 40 UMCOR hygiene kits as a part of the Annual Conference drive.
