In September, we will be doing a sermon series named, "Speak, Lord." It is a series on the many ways God calls us to serve. My own call story has grown through the years. When I was a child, my parents report that they would stand at my bedroom door and hear me talking to what I called "my angels." But, as I got older those angels faded into the background of my life. Every now and then I would get a hint, a nudge, or a whisper that there was more to the world than I could see, but I quickly dismissed it. I now know that God was with me even when I wandered away and got too busy.

When I was in college I was learning so much about the world and I realized that I had to make a choice about the kind of person I wanted to be. I had the advantage of being far from home, so no one had any expectations about who I was. I was free to choose my own direction. I was seeing a lot of people my age making many choices, good and bad, as they spread their wings at college. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, went off to college, and he too was exploring the kind of person he wanted to be in this new adult world. He famously formed a club, a small group of brothers in Christ, who met weekly to ask, "How is it with your soul?" and to hold each other accountable to the Christian lifestyle they professed. His fellow classmates, as a taunt, called this club "The Methodists." Like John Wesley, I tend to be methodical in my approach to life at times. I like to keep a paper planner (in addition to my electronic calendar). I love to make reservations so I know where I am going and can plot how to get there. My friends don't taunt me, but they do call me "organized." So it was natural for me, in college, to decide I needed a rule of life to follow so that I could be consistent in my choices. I wanted to be a good adult.

One evening, I shared my thoughts with a new friend. He said, "Why don't you live the life of a Christian?" I said I wasn't sure that I believed in Jesus. What he said next has stuck with me for over 20 years. He said, "If your parents died in a car accident when you were a child, would you stop believing you had parents? Just because you don't see them doesn't mean they are not a part of you." Then he said, "Why don't you study Jesus? Pretend that you believe and see how it goes?" I stopped pretending a few years after that conversation because I started to believe on my own, deep in my soul. The grace that Jesus gave me during those years, and today, gave me a new perspective on life. In those years, Jesus nudged me, waited for me, heard my prayers, and gave me Christian companions who listened and challenged me. Jesus kept showing up in what I call "God moments." The Lord definitely spoke to me in specific ways that I could understand, so that my faith would increase. I don't really know where or when God's call on my life began. I don't know a day or time that I chose to follow Jesus. What I do know is that it all started with God, who calls me "my child."

In September, we will hear all the many ways folks in our congregation are called by God. What is your call story? What part of the story are you in now? Our key verse will be 1 Samuel 3:10 "Then the Lord came and stood there, calling just as before, Samuel, Samuel! Samuel said, Speak. Your servant is listening." Child of God, are you listening to God's call? Are you brave enough to say, "Speak, Lord?"



# **Adult Discipleship**

**Adult Discipleship 'Fast Track**'. A 12 week long course that dives deep into scripture. A wonderful foundational course for anyone looking to explore, deepen, or renew their understanding of the Bible. Daily readings of 3 to 4 chapters of the Bible, with class meeting on Sunday evenings from Sept 10th to Nov 19th.

### **ONGOING NEEDS - FOOD PANTRIES AND SAFE HARBOR**

Our food pantry partners are seeing record numbers almost every week. Most-needed items remain the same - peanut butter; 15 oz. cans of tomato sauce; 1 lb. spaghetti; canned fruit and vegetables; canned soups and beans; canned chicken and tuna; boxed cereal; oatmeal; ravioli/spaghettios; nonrefrigerated microwave meals; diapers and wipes (sizes 4, 5 and 6 are most needed).
