The Advent season here. This is the beginning of the Christian calendar year, the period of preparation and anticipation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word "adventus," meaning "coming" or "arrival."

Advent is a time of reflection, prayer, and spiritual preparation for the celebration of Christmas. How are you preparing your heart for Christmas? St. Ignatius of Loyola developed the daily examen as one of his spiritual practices at the end of his day to help him see God's hand at work in his whole day. This practice can be useful at this time of the year as we Christians reflect on God's presence in our lives. We can look back as see how the Spirit moved in our lives over the past year. Here is how to pray the examen;

- 1. Place yourself in God's presence. Give thanks for God's great love for you.
- 2. Pray for the grace to understand how God is acting in your life.
- 3. Review your year. Maybe write some notes down of the some of the highlights, but also some of the low lights. What were specific moments of the year that you remember? What were you feeling at the time? Now that some time has passed, how has the Spirit acted in that situation? What can you see more clearly now?
- 4. Reflect on what you did, said, or thought or how you reacted in those instances. Were you drawing closer to God, or further away? How has the Holy Spirit made God's presence known to you throughout the year? Where did God show up that you did not expect?
- 5. Look toward the new year. Think of how you might collaborate more effectively with God's plan. Be specific. Where do you need to grow? What burdens do you need to let go of? How will you prepare your heart for the coming of Christ in fresh ways in the new year?

Christmas is not just a day on the calendar, it lives in our hearts throughout the year. It serves as a reminder to be always mindful of the significance of the birth of Jesus and also to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. We Christians live in the "both/and;" we both remember the birth of Christ and anticipate Jesus coming again, as affirmed in Scripture. So Advent, like Lent, is a time to reflect and remember but also to prepare our hearts for our Savior. So this Advent, once again, will you invite the Holy Spirit to examen your heart? "Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me." (Psalm 51:10) Then offer that clean heart and renewed Spirit as your Christmas gift to Jesus?

# Holiday Hospitality

I am writing this in mid-November, and I have already seen plenty of Christmas decorations in stores, heard a carol or two, and started my Christmas shopping. Our culture loves Christmas! No matter how "un-Christian" or "post-Christian" our culture becomes, Christmas still matters to our community. For this reason, we usually see a spike in church attendance during the holiday season and especially on Christmas Eve. With that in mind, we want to share some very practical ways you can extend hospitality at church this season:

Choose a different parking spot. If you are able, park farther away from the church entrance. Not only will you get in more steps to work off those Christmas cookie calories, but you will also make closer parking spaces available for newcomers or those who find it physically difficult to get to our doors.

Sit in the middle of the row. It's natural to want to grab the end seat when you arrive for worship, but when a first-time guest has to walk past (or climb over) 3 or 4 people in order to get to a seat, it can be awkward and uncomfortable. Leave the seats on the ends of the row open for newcomers (and latecomers).

Introduce yourself to someone new. Make this your challenge for every Sunday in December (and on into 2024). You may meet a first-time visitor or make a new connection with someone who worships beside you every Sunday. Either way, your kindness will go a long way towards creating an environment of welcome and belonging.

These simple acts of hospitality help to create a warm and inviting first impression of our church. This is just one of the ways we are loving people to life this Christmas.

Below are the highlighted mission efforts that you can donate to in memory of, in honor of, or as a Christmas present. Gifts for the Manger information and gift cards are in the Welcome Center and Narthex. The causes being supported this year are:

Food Ministries (Local)

Food Pantries – RRUMC supports three food pantries at Ginter Park UMC and St. Paul Catholic Church on the Northside of Richmond and Belmont UMC on the Southside. In addition, we provide food to Safe Harbor, which provides the support that survivors of sexual and domestic violence and human trafficking need to overcome their crisis and to transform their lives.

Housing (Local)

Virginia Supportive Housing, founded in 1988 by our own Karl and Jane Bren houses 1600 formerly homeless persons, including the chronically homeless and veterans. Their new building in Eastern Henrico will house 85 formerly homeless and contains office space for two of its largest programs. The office space will be named the Karl and Jane Bren Center. Donations will go to fund this new space in memory of Karl and Jane who gave so much to RRUMC and many other missions in the community.

Disaster Relief

United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Disaster Recovery -(National & International) UMCOR is the humanitarian relief and development arm of The United Methodist Church, and is working in areas devastated by weather events and wars.
