## From Pastor Sarah

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." Galatians 5:22-23

Years ago I did an exploration of happiness. I was trying to really understand what sustained happiness looked like. I read many books and talked to many people and of course, I prayed. Somewhere in that journey the phrase "choose joy" came into my being. It became a mantra for me. When folks around me were sharing gossip that put other people down, I chose joy. I chose to focus on the positive and speak up for the good things going on in the world. I turned off the negative messages the world was blaring at me, as best I could, and focused on the good. As I started to consciously choose joy, God changed me so that I could see it more easily. During that time of transformation I realized that happiness is an emotion whereas joy is a gift of the Spirit. I learned that happiness comes through laughter, hugs, celebrations, and a good day. All of those things last only a moment, but joy comes from a deeper place. Joy is a gift of the Holy Spirit, and that means that Jesus and I are working together to produce joy. This joy that is produced then is not as fleeting as an emotion. Joy is what sustains our Christian faith.

All of these lessons came to mind recently as I was reflecting on my new habits during Lent. The Spirit brought me a new phrase, "seek hope." I heard a person ask someone, "How do you stay so positive and happy every day?" and her answer was, "I seek hope every day. In every situation, I look for the light that is breaking through." I chewed on that thought for a bit as I considered exploring hope this season. It occurred to me that this might be a bit easier because in every situation where we need to seek hope, we can look to Jesus. Easter is on the horizon and it gives us the gift of eternal hope. Even though this spring, the world all around us will cry out "hope," we still need Jesus to transform our souls so that the message of hope goes deeper in us. We must seek the hope that will sustain us in life. The good news is that we do not do this work alone. In fact the one who does the work with us, Jesus, is also the one who gives us hope because of Easter. So let us make a habit of choosing joy and seeking hope during Lent. Let's give room for the Spirit to transform us so that our happiness on Easter is not fleeting but is eternal.

#### STRENGTHEN YOUR FAITH

The prayer of the daily Examen was developed by Saint Ignatius of Loyola in 1522. It remains a powerful form of prayer and self-reflection. Practice the Examen at the close of each day.

#### Prepare for prayer

Find a comfortable position. Begin with a few deep breaths to calm your heart and mind. Acknowledge the intent of this prayer: to grow closer with God.

#### **Thanksgiving**

Start by thanking God for the gifts of the day and anything you are grateful for.

#### **Review**

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you see your day clearly. What stands out from your day? Particular emotions or events? Moments you felt close to God or noticed God working? Times you felt far from God and from who you are called to be?

#### Respond

What might God be telling you through your feelings and experiences from today? Ask forgiveness for the times you weren't at your best. Offer up more gratitude for the blessings that stood out. Whatever comes to mind, talk with God about it.

#### Look to tomorrow

What are you excited for? What are you nervous about? Visualize yourself walking through the day with God and ask for God's help.

#### Close

Spend a few more moments with God, listening for God and finding peace in God's presence.
